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**Guidelines on Ethical Standards for Students, Faculty, Governing Body, and
Administration as Authorized by Competent Authority**



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Code of Conduct

1. Preamble

This document outlines the Code of Conduct and practices applicable to all students across various programs at the institute. Compliance with this Code is mandatory for all students, and it is readily available on the official institute website for reference.

2. Jurisdiction

The Code applies to students enrolled in UG/PG/Ph.D. degree programs, as well as certificate and diploma programs. It covers conduct within the institute premises, including sponsored activities and events organized by recognized student associations. Additionally, it extends to conduct outside the premises that may impact the institute's interests or reputation.

3. Ethics and Conduct

To safeguard against such malpractices, the institution has instituted a comprehensive Code of Ethics and Plagiarism Prevention Committee.

Key Principles and Measures:

- ❖ An Ethics Committee, consisting of all PhD holders within the institute, has been established. Its primary role is to evaluate the research submissions, including Research Publications, Research Proposals, Thesis Work (PG), and Project Reports.
- ❖ Rigorous scrutiny, particularly for faculty and PG student research presented in the form of journal papers or projects, involves a meticulous plagiarism check. The committee ensures adherence to high academic and production standards.
- ❖ The committee takes additional steps to validate that the research work aligns with national and international standards, maintaining excellence.
- ❖ Utilization of campus-available software, such as Plagiarism CheckerX, is encouraged. Faculty researchers are required to submit a plagiarism report (maximum limit 20%) along with their papers for committee review. Similarly, all PhD and PG students must submit a plagiarism report (maximum limit 20%), a no-objection certificate from their guide, and co-authors for project work approval.
- ❖ Violations and plagiarism-related complaints are addressed promptly. The committee, comprising the Principal, Dean R&D, HOD of the Respective Department, and Project Guide, takes necessary disciplinary actions within one month of receiving a complaint. Depending on the severity, a detailed report with recommendations for disciplinary action is submitted.
